The Presidential Preference Primary was held on March 15, 2016. The City of Edgewood was scheduled to hold an election, as the three seats held by Council Members Pam Henley, Dan Drummond and Mike Hendrix had met their two year terms. Four Edgewood residents qualified; however, one candidate withdrew their name prior to the election.

Due to the candidate’s withdrawal, the three Council seats would be filled and no municipal election was necessary. The names of the four candidates were still on the ballot because the ballots had already been printed. Please meet your Council Members who were sworn in on March 22, 2016.

City Council Update

The City Council President is charged with recommending and appointing, with City Council’s confirmation, residents to serve on the Charter Review Commission (CRC). At least every seven years, a seven member CRC is given responsibility to review the City Charter and recommend any changes it deems necessary.

The CRC will gather recommendations from the Mayor, members of City Council, City Staff and Edgewood citizens, complete a review and submit a report to the citizens and City Council of Edgewood. Any amendments to the City Charter must be approved by voters in the March 2017 Municipal Election. The charter can only be changed by a majority vote of the electorate.

The primary goals of the CRC are to:

- ◆ Enhance government efficiency
- ◆ Evaluate possible changes
- ◆ Provide a forum for public input
- ◆ Review the charter to determine its adequacy and suitability to the needs to the city
- ◆ Review the existing structure of city government

A Word From Chief Francisco

To friends, neighbors and businesses,

Edgewood has had a decrease in residential burglaries during the last quarter. The exception has been the Holden Area, which has experienced an increase. As summer approaches we would like to remind our citizens of a few safety techniques.

- Remember to lock your car doors — no matter where you are. The majority of vehicle burglaries are to unlocked vehicles. You should always lock your vehicles at home, work and while shopping.
- Lock your residences when not at home, even if you are leaving for a walk or running to your local convenience store. Lock your doors and windows.
- If you have an alarm system, activate your alarm when you are not at home. Update your alarm system notification to ensure the alarm company has the proper contact numbers for you as well as those who are on the notification form.



- If you own a gun, please make certain you have it properly secured. If you have one in your vehicle PLEASE lock your car at all times. Most guns which are used in felony crimes are stolen from unsecured vehicles.
- Many of us have watercraft. Review safety techniques with family members and double check your boat to make sure all safety equipment is up to date and in good working condition.
- If leaving on vacation for 14 days or less, please go to the Edgewood Police Department website and complete the [Vacation Residence Request Form](#), as we can help watch your property.


Intersection Improvement Update:


Waterwise Landscaping Helps Save Water

Often, the biggest use of water by people is outdoors for lawn and landscape irrigation. To find a balance in our uses of water and the needs of nature, water conservation must be a part of people’s everyday practices. Using water wisely in our landscapes is one way to find that balance.

Waterwise is a common sense way to landscape that conserves water and protects the environment. The main objective is to establish and maintain a healthy landscape by matching the right plants with existing site conditions so that the use of additional resources — such as water, fertilizer, pesticides and labor — is minimized.

In addition, waterwise landscaping practices reduce the amount of pollutants reaching water bodies because fewer yard chemicals are used. Fertilizers and pesticides can contaminate waterways when they are washed out of the yard with the rain in stormwater runoff.

Florida’s water management districts were established to make sure that people and nature have the water they need. Gardening Around Town

Our trellis is smothered under the highly fragrant pink jasmine.

Having a continuous display of color in the garden is a cinch with careful plant selection and proper planting. Once you have matched the plants to the conditions they will experience in your garden, determine their bloom color and season of color.

When selecting colors we keep these principles in mind:

- Colors influence our sense of temperature. We may feel a difference of five to seven degrees in temperature between a blue-green room and a red-orange room.
- Yellows, reds and oranges may be combined to create a 'warm' mixture that creates excitement. Known as advancing colors, they attract the eye, make objects seem closer and visually shrink a space.
- A 'cool' mixture of blues, purples and greens creates a setting for relaxation. Known as receding colors, they make objects seem farther away and visually expand a space.
- Extreme contrast is obtained from complementary colors (opposite each other on the color wheel) such as orange and blue (Go Gators!), yellow and purple and red and green.
- Medium contrast is found among the colors from the triad color

interval (any three colors equidistant-distance apart on the color wheel). For example: yellow and blue, red and yellow, red and blue, orange and green or purple and green.

- Analogous colors which are neighboring hues that all share one color provide low contrast. Some combinations include: yellow, yellow-green and green or orange, orange-red and red or green, blue-green and blue.
- The use of white or silver/gray neutralizes strong contrasts. They help visually blend colors together.
- Brighter colors such as yellow, white and the pastels shine in shady areas

To achieve non-stop color at a variety of levels look for a combination of trees, shrubs, vines, groundcovers, perennials/bulbs and annuals. We design with pergolas, trellises, arbors, arches, obelisks, tuteurs and containers including hanging baskets to stretch the color from ground to sky.





LAKE CONWAY SAFE BOATING TIPS

Submitted By the Lake Conway Water and Navigation Control District Advisory Board

BE COURTEOUS to lakefront property owners and to those who share the lake with you.

DON'T LITTER. Trash is unsightly and can cause environmental hazards and threats to wildlife.

AVOID MAKING LARGE WAKES in shallow water or near the shoreline.

FOLLOW AT SAFE DISTANCES.

IT IS PROHIBITED TO OPERATE a vessel, water ski or wakeboard with a blood alcohol content of 0.08 percent or higher or while under the influence of drugs.

- In order to operate a motorboat of 10 horsepower or greater, Florida law requires anyone who was born on or after January 1, 1988 to successfully complete an approved boating safety course and obtain a Boating Safety Education Identification Card issued by the FWC. <http://myfwc.com/boating/safety-education/id/>
- All operators are responsible for operating their vessel in a reasonable and prudent manner with regard for other vessel traffic, posted restrictions and other circumstances so as not to endanger people or property. Failure to do so is considered careless operation.
- A person must be at least 14 years of age to operate a personal watercraft in Florida.
- All vessels, with the exception of non-motor-powered vessels less than 16 ft in length, non-motor-powered canoes, kayaks, racing shells or rowing sculls, regardless of length, must be registered through your local Tax Collector's Office. The Certificate of Registration must be on board and available for inspection by an enforcement officer whenever the vessel is operated. <http://www.flhsmv.gov/dmv/faqboat.html>
- Recreational vessels are required to display navigation lights between sunset and sunrise and during periods of reduced visibility (fog, rain, haze, etc.).
- Personal watercraft may not be operated from ½ hour after sunset to ½ hour before sunrise, even if navigation lights are used. The owner and/or operator of a vessel is responsible to carry, store, maintain and use the safety equipment required by the U.S. Coast Guard. <http://www.uscgboating.org/fedregs/default.html>






Residential Garage and Estate Sales — Don't Forget Your Permit

The City of Edgewood requires you to obtain a permit for residential garage and estate sales conducted within the city limits. There is no cost and takes only a few minutes to process. The following are the regulations governing garage and estate sales :

- A permit is obtained from City Hall, prior to the sale. Permit applications can be downloaded from Edgewood's website at www.Edgewood-FL.gov.
- Sales are held no more than three times in a calendar year.
- Sales may be no more than two consecutive weekends.
- All directional or advertising signs must comply in accordance with the City's Sign Code and not placed in the right of way and must be removed at the conclusion of the event.
